Parents only need to attend ONE session. In our diocese children baptized in the Roman Catholic Church celebrate Reconciliation in grade 2, Eucharist in grade 3 and Confirmation in grade 6. All children receiving sacraments in the 2018 - 2019 school year, whether they attend Catholic school or otherwise, must be registered at a forum. Plan to be there for the full 2 hours.



24th Sunday in Ordinary Time: FAITH AND WORKS

Isaiah 50:5 - 9. Salvation through the Lord's servant **James 2:14 - 18.** Faith and good works **Mark 8:27 - 35.** First teaching of the paschal event and the doctrine of the cross

Key Passage: So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. *James 2:17 - 18*
