

Q. What happens when the Procession reaches the Altar?

A. Those in the procession show respect for the altar. The Book of Gospels is placed on the altar. The cross and the candles are placed in the sanctuary. The Priest kisses the altar and may incense it. This veneration takes place before the Priest goes to his chair.
