Sacrament Registration for Reconciliation, Eucharist & Confirmation

Registrations is now available <u>online</u>, until **September 30, 2023.** Go to saintjoseph.ca/sacraments to register.

In our archdiocese, children baptized in the Roman Catholic Church celebrate *Reconciliation in grade 2, Eucharist in grade 3 and Confirmation in grade 6*. All children receiving sacraments in the 2023/2024 school year, whether they attend Catholic school or otherwise, must be registered online. You need to provide a copy of your child's baptism certificate to the parish office.

Items Needed at the Salvation Army Foodbank:


