
My Redemption CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME

What Is A Jubilee?

Jubilee was first mentioned in the Book of Leviticus, which mandated that every 50 years personal debts would be forgiven and indentured servants freed. The practice was later adopted by the Church, eventually settling on one every 25 years. The last regular jubilee was 2000, marking the beginning of the 3rd millennium, and in 2016 a special jubilee, the Year of Mercy, was called. At the heart of each jubilee is God's mercy and forgiveness.

The jubilee in 2025, "Pilgrims of Hope," begins Christmas Eve 2024. Throughout the year, Catholics are encouraged to participate in various religious practices, such as retreat, regularly celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation, and even pilgrimages to Rome or other holy sites. Throughout the jubilee year there will be many special events in the parish and Archdiocese. In particular, we will be holding a parish mission on the same theme "Pilgrims of Hope" in April. We pray that this year will be a truly sacred time of God's grace and mercy.
