PARISH MISSION- PILGRIMS OF HOPE


On Monday night of the Pilgrims of Hope Parish Mission, the theme was "Living in a Hope-filled Church". During his talk, Fr. Ivel explained the different meanings of "church": as a building, congregation, greater organization, and belief system. He also spoke of St. Paul's letters and asked the question, "What kind of letter would Paul write to St. Joseph Parish in Grande Prairie?" We thought about his rhetorical question. Later, he said that St. Joseph Parish had "something special" and that the Holy Spirit was definitely present here. This statement filled us with hope, and gave us pride in our brothers and sisters in Christ. Now, we think St. Paul would write a glowing letter to our parish, and this encourages us to continue to pour into our faith community.

The next night's theme, "The Gift of Hope in Reconciliation", didn't seem ground-breaking at first. We came expecting a homily about why reconciliation is great and an important sacrament, something we've heard before. But mainly we went to receive the Sacrament; neither of us had received reconciliation in years. That night, Fr. Ivel spoke about what sin really is. He took us through his experience walking through Auschwitz, the Nazi death camp. He changed how we thought about Jesus' forgiveness and how transcendent God's love is. Then, Fr. Ivel went through some common questions about the Sacrament, and removed any doubt about its essentialness in our life.

The Pilgrims of Hope Parish Mission moved us closer to God, and our church community, with prayer, reflection, and God's grace.

'RETURNING HOME'- FROM A YOUNG ADULT

I think anyone, seasoned or new-to-the-faith Catholics should consider attending these sessions. They are short and sweet, and so are those spear-heading the discussion. I am a cradle Catholic; I grew up with the sacraments and attended Mass diligently 1-2x per week every week for the last 3-4 years. Yet I knew I could learn something from the experience in that room, and simply going was an opportunity to grow in faith, application to daily life, as well as community. The bonus of this is getting to know our priests better! You can ask them direct questions, hear about their experiences, and allow them to expand your views of prayer, scripture, reconciliation, the Creed, the Mass, and associated articles. Only once a week for a mere 6 weeks, what could you learn? Who could you meet in the tiny church of Catholics Returning Home? Who could benefit from walking alongside you during this journey?



RECEPTION INTO THE CHURCH

I was brought up in a protestant family that had a strong faith in God and provided a firm biblical foundation. My wife's upbringing was similar, and we are both grateful. I was baptized at 12 years of age, on June 22, 1996, at Grande Prairie Alliance Church, (unaware that my future wife was also baptized at that same service).

My wife and I have walked through the Rite of Election, Reconciliation, Confirmation, and the Eucharist during this Lenten season. We are so blessed to have done this together and we are thankful for the help of everyone in OCIA, including our sponsors. We continue to seek to grow and learn and we look forward to attending Mass every week.

His Story:


